COALDRAKE

Emeritus Professor Peter Coaldrake AO, is currently the Chair of the Board of the Queensland Performing Arts Trust, a Commissioner of the Tertiary Education Quality and Standards Agency (TEQSA), and Board member of the Queensland Community Foundation. He will take up the role of Chief Commissioner of TEQSA in March 2021.

Upon taking up his current TEQSA Commissioner appointment he stepped down from two other roles, as Chair of Jobs Queensland, and as an external Council member of The University of Newcastle. Professor Coaldrake completed his almost fifteen-year term as Vice-Chancellor and CEO of Queensland University of Technology (QUT) in December 2017, and is a former Chair of both the peak body for Australia's Universities, Universities Australia (UA) and the governing board of the OECD's then higher education group (IMHE).

In October 2018 he was appointed by Federal Education Minister, the Honourable Dan Tehan, to conduct a review into the Higher Education Provider Category Standards. In 2018 he also undertook two separate Reviews for the Queensland government: one dealing with the present and future Queensland public sector workforce, and the other of the future of vocational education, training and skilling in central-western Queensland, focusing on the performance of the Agricultural Colleges.

A dual Fulbright scholar, Professor Coaldrake has authored or edited a number of books and monographs including, most recently, *Raising the Stakes: Gambling with the Future of Universities* (co-authored with Dr Lawrence Stedman, UQP, 2013; 2nd ed. 2016).

He is the recipient of a 'Queensland Great' Award (2017) and the Asia Pacific Leadership Award by the Council for Advancement and Support of Education (2016).

Dale is currently Professor of Taxation Law and Academic Discipline Lead of Taxation in the Curtin Law School. He is also the Chair of the Academic Board and a member of the University Council at Curtin University and the elected Academic Representative for Curtin on the UniSuper Consultative Committee.

He is the immediate past Chair of the Tax Institute's National Education Quality Assurance Board (a position he held for 10 years) and is a member of the Tertiary Education Quality and Standards Agency (TEQSA) Register of Experts. Dale served as an inaugural member of the National Tax Practitioners Board and is a current member of the Board of Taxation's high-level Advisory Panel and the ATO's Public Guidance and Advice Panel. Dale is also an Executive Member of the Australian Branch of the International Tax Policy Think Tank, the International Fiscal Association (IFA) and a Member of the Chamber of Commerce and Industry WA (CCIWA) Economic Development Forum.

Dale has extensive board experience including six years on a not-for-profit Board in the disability sector, three years on a regulatory Board (Tax Practitioners Board) and is currently a Director and Deputy President of CPA Australia which is one of the largest professional bodies in the world with a global membership of 166,166 members (as at 31 December 2019) in more than 100 countries around the world.
